Practical Experience & Knowledge



- At the NPO Seibo Japan, we partner extensively with over 30 high schools and universities across Japan to develop businesses that support school meal programs in Malawi, conduct international aid workshops, and engage in real-world marketing and sales activities.
- Drawing on the NPO's diverse range of experience, this course incorporates the essential knowledge that is required for effective support activities. The course then accurately conveys the key information to the participants, and overall guides them towards concrete, hands-on practice.
- Many of the courses' participants have utilized the lessons that they have been taught through a range of different ways — for example, student participants have applied the knowledge that they have gained within university entrance exams in Japan, admission to overseas graduate schools, and extracurricular projects.

The online course starts on the first Monday of each month, and is held once a week (Learning materials and schedule management are provided through Google Classroom.)

- •Translated their social marketing proposals and ideas into actionable plans










Final Presentation Example 2

- A wonderful and enriching experience, where the students listened to a talk about Seibo Japan and the aid that they supply to Malawi. The students were also given the opportunity to try the delicious Malawian Coffee!

The Planning and Organization of School Workshops

Examples:

- Designing an original curriculum that includes the topics of aid wenprovide to Malawi.
- Visitations to elementary, junior high, and high schools in order to spread awareness and information to younger students.
- Implement the newly designed curriculum by delivering it into real classroom settings.





Final Presentations Example 4

Participants can take part in real life support projects, and once completed they can obtain an official certificate that will present their experiences.

★ Participants:

- -Significantly aided kindergartens by improving the school meal environment and helping to install a well for the Malawian community to use.
- Held meetings with the Malawian staff, where ideas were exchanged in order to figure out the best way to initiate a support project.
- -After the event had ended, many participants continued to work as a volunteer staff member, proving their dedication to aiding Malawi.

The Participation Requirements and Outcomes of the Online Course:

Recommended Criteria for Eligible Participants:

- Reading and listening skills equivalent to EIKEN Grade 2
- Willingness to actively communicate with staff and other participants in English
- Ability to research areas of interest and spend time exploring them with staff
- Access to basic online devices

Learning Outcomes:

- •An opportunity to learn about international business
- The privilege to learn about and deepen understanding of charity activities
- Chance to collaboratively plan and take action in activities
- •To have improved communication skills in English
- Gain motivation and confidence for post-course activities
- •Certificate of completion from a UK company
- Interaction with participants and instructors (including interns from overseas)

Voices from the Community:

- •Participants can learn directly from Malawian teachers about the current situation and challenges Malawi faces.
- •Questions from the participants can be answered through conversations conducted in English.

- •By being able to interact with people in distant countries and nations that they wouldn't normally have access to, participants gain a closer understanding of the international community and its challenges.
- •With the help from the staff, the participants are given the opportunity to plan charity activites

Through this learning experience, I was able to gain knowledge and an insight into a topic that I could have never learned in everyday life, allowing me to develop a broader, more multifaceted perspective.

It was an invaluable experience to learn about topics such as charity, social enterprises, and leadership from people living in various countries — including Poland, the UK, Malawi, and Japan — subjects that are rarely taught in ordinary settings.

Through international exchanges with staff from Malawi and Poland, I had the opportunity to learn about concepts such as social enterprise and charity, whilst exploring from my own perspective how I could approach and help solve issues faced in Malawi.

When working on my final presentation for the course, I faced some challenges, but with the strong support from the Japanese staff—who even arranged meetings with the Malawian team—I was able to overcome them. This experience became a valuable foundation that led me to pursue further studies at the University of Sussex in the UK.

The course experience was incredibly valuable; it helped me expand on what I had learned at university and discover a path for applying my knowledge in society. Even if you feel uncertain about communicating in English, I encourage you to take the challenge—it will definitely be a rewarding experience.

Thanks to the students' proposal, a *Fair Trade & Charity* tea and coffee sales event was held, during which Malawian coffee was sold.

Process from Application to Course Start Date

- 1 The application form and program terms will be sent to the participant.
- 2 After you return the completed application form, an invoice will be issued.
- ③ Once payment is confirmed, you will receive an invitation to Google Classroom.
- 4 A pre-start meeting will be conducted before the course begins.
- (5) The classes will then start.
- if you apply by the 25th of the month, you can begin the program on the first Monday of the following month.
